1. Public Comment—no public comment
2. Approve May 11, 2016 minutes—approved unanimously upon motion by John Gaustad and second by Ann Brooks.
3. Updates on bicycle, pedestrian and wayfinding projects—The committee discussed the completion of the 2015 phase of the Leeds rail trail extension and four projects at the 25% design phase: Damon Road, Exit 19 roundabout, N.King Street roundabout, and the Rocky Hill Greenway.
4. Main Street four design options—In anticipation of the Main Street Demonstration Day street tactical urbanism project, Phil Goff presented four possible design options (separated bicycle lanes, median bicycle lane, median park/parking, and dedicated bus and bicycle lanes) that will be on boards for the day for public review and comment. There was discussion about how to view not just to move travel modes through Main Street but also approach from the perspective of pedestrians using the city.
