- 1. Members present/absent: Present: Councilor Marianne LaBarge and Chair, Councilor Alisa F. Klein Absent: Councilor Gina-Louise Sciarra
- 2. Meeting Called to Order: At 4:00 pm Councilor LaBarge called the meeting to order.
- 3. Announcement of Audio/Video Recording of Meeting: Councilor LaBarge announced that the meeting would be recorded.
- 4. Approval of Minutes from March 16, 2015: Councilor Klèin moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting; Councilor LaBarge seconded the motion. The motion was approved on a voice vote of 2 Yes, 0 No, 1 Absent.
- 5. Claire Higgins present: ed information on Community Action:
- Community Action works with people to provide economic opportunities. Community Action was founded in 1965. The agency works with more than 30,000 people during any one year.
- Largest program operated by Community Action in terms of employment is the Head Start Program. The program provides quality child care so that parents can work or attend school.
- W.I.C. is also a Community Action Program. New moms can get information about breast feeding and can also get coupons for food. The goal is to provide nutrition for families in need.
- Fuel assistance is the largest dollar program run by Community Action. Over 7,000 households are serviced in the area. In general, families get the equivalent of one tank-full of fuel. The service is provided to the elderly, veterans and families. Families who qualify for fuel assistance, are also eligible for home weatherization review free of charge.
- The program also runs food programs in Shelburne Falls and Franklin County.
- The Program also provides first steps for help; someone can call and find out the next step to provide continued support.
- Adult Education and Job Skills-Community Action operates a Harmon Personnel Staffing Service which places
  qualified individuals in temporary jobs.
- Money Management-Tax preparation services and financial counseling is available.
- Youth Program-The organization works to provide free youth development programs for ages 14-21.
- Conflict Resolution- The Mediation and Training Collaborative provides programs to help students, teachers, and school administrators learn mediation skills and resolve conflicts; the staff are professional mediators who are available to assist in conflict resolution.
- Healing from Trauma—essentially, this program provides support to victims of crime or trauma, such as those
  affected by drunken driving, hate crimes, homicide, abuse and more.
- Family Support: A family center is located in Greenfield.
- Claire Higgins also distributed the program's Annual Report.
- 6. Rebecca Bovat presented information about the Northampton's Veteran's Agency and Tim Daley presented information about the Veterns's Council:

Information was presented to the group regarding the Northampton Veteran's Appreciation Day that is taking place on May 23<sup>rd</sup> At Look Park in Florence. The event is free to all veterans and their families and will feature games, food and music.
