Councilor Murphy moved approval of the order in the first reading; Councilor LaBarge seconded the motion. The order passed in first reading on a Roll Call Vote of 9 Yes, 0 No.

Director of Planning and Sustainability, Wayne Feiden requested that the Council perform two readings so that the an agreement could be reached with the land owner as soon as possible

Upon the recommendation of Mayor David J. Narkewicz and the Conservation Commission

Whereas, The *Open Space, Recreation and Multi-Use Trail Plan: 2011-2018* recommends open space connections at the former Northampton State Hospital and at the Arcadia Wildlife Sanctuary; and

Whereas, The *Plan* also recommends connecting rail trails from the New Haven and Northampton Canal Trail to the Manlian Rail Trail spur at Ice Pond Drive; and

Whereas, The Sanderson/Hewes family has agreed to sell 47.6± acres (Map IDs 37-049 and 37-067), fronting on Easthampton Road (Route 10), Rocky Hill Road (Route 66), and the New Haven and Northampton Rail Trail; and

Whereas, This land provides the best ecological connection between Arcadia and the former State Hospital agriculture land and the best trail connection between the two multi-use trails; and

Whereas, On May 1, 2014 City Council appropriated \$200,000 towards the purchase price of this land from Community Preservation Act funds; and

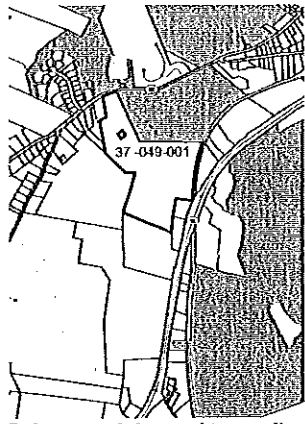
Whereas, Community donations, grants, and assistance from the Massachusetts Audubon Society will fund the remainder of the \$387,500 purchase price and no additional appropriation is required; and

Whereas,

Ordered, that

The Conservation Commission is authorized to purchase or otherwise acquire for conservation and passive recreation purposes, as provided by MGL Chapter 40, §8C, any fee, easement or conservation restriction as defined in MGL Chapter 184, §31 or any other interest in the above land and any immediately adjoining land; that the City Council hereby accepts such conservation restrictions; that the Conservation Commission is authorized to grant conservation restrictions on any land so acquired; and that any such grants, donations, or sales shall be used to reimburse the conservation open space fund used for the purchase;

Further, that the city shall retain the right to build multi-use trail(s) through the property from the New Haven and Northampton Rail Trail to Rocky Hill Road.

- 6. Financial Order: \$2,450 appropriated from the CPA Budget the Fitzgerald Lake Invasive Plant Eradication Project (2nd Reading)

Councilor Murphy moved approval of the order in second reading; Councilor Carney seconded the motion.

Councilor Spector moved to recognize Robert Zimmerman, President of the Broad Brook Coalition, Bernadette Giblin of Safeground Organic Landcare in Northampton and Mike Bald of Got Weeds? In Royalton, VT; Councilor LaBarge seconded the motion. The motion passed on a voice vote of 9 Yes, 0 No.

Robert Zimmerman, described the difficulties that have been encountered in trying to eradicate Phragmites australis, a fast-growing, invasive species that has been identified in a remote location in the Fitzgerald Lake area. The exact location is difficult to access. The eradication will preserve native habitat of the Broad Brook, some of which is rare and endangered.

Bernadette Giblin spoke about the environmental risks of Rodeo herbicide as a method of eradicating phragmites. Rodeo contains the active ingredient Glyphosate. This chemical has been banned in certain countries. This particular chemical has a negative impact on vernal pools. She also feels that this method of eradication has the potential for re-growth. Ms. Giblin offered potential alternative to removal of phragmites, including removing undersized culverts, breaching berms, and gene silencing.

Mike Bald spoke about non-chemical methods to manage invasive species. He believes that the goal to managing phragmites should be to seek non-chemical, organic alternatives. In addition, stewardship of the land is a responsible method for making any eradication method a long-term effective solution.

Councilor Spector offered that Rodeo is used in Martha's Vineyard to control this dominant invasive species. The team of conservationists in Martha's Vineyard evaluated other methods; none were effective. They chose Rodeo as a solution to their invasive species problem.

The motion to approve in second reading passed on a Roll Call Vote of 8 Yes, 1 No (Councilor Klein).

Ordered, that

WHEREAS, the Broad Brook Coalition submitted an expedited application for Community Preservation Act funding for priority invasive species removal in the 2014 growing season of approximately one acre of *Phragmites australis* within the Fitzgerald Lake Conservation Area.

WHEREAS, the project will help to improve and preserve the health of Northampton's premier wildlife conservation area by preventing the expansion of a threatening invasive wetland plant

WHEREAS, the project's control and removal of invasive plants meets goals established by the Northampton Open Space Recreation and Multi-Use Trail Plan.

WHEREAS, the applicant has used these funds effectively in the past.

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2014, the Northampton Community Preservation Committee, voted unanimously to recommend \$2,450 in Community Preservation Act funds be used to support this project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED,

That \$2,450 be appropriated from Community Preservation Act funding to the Fitzgerald Lake Invasive Plant Eradication Project. And, that the grantee meets the conditions approved by the Community Preservation Committee, the Mayor, and City Council.

Specifically, \$2,450 is appropriated from the CPA Budgeted Reserve (account #2344930-359930).

At 9:35pm Councilor Murphy made a motion to take a short recess; Councilor Spector seconded the motion. The motion passed on a voice vote of 9 Yes, 0 No. At 9:45 pm City Council reconvened.

- I. Order: Authorization for the Mayor to execute and cause to be recorded 7 Notices of Activity and Use Limitation for City Properties (*1st Reading*)

Councilor LaBarge moved to approve in first reading; Councilor O'Donnell seconded.

Mayor Narkewicz provided the Councilors an overview of what has been discussed regarding moving forward with development of the Roundhouse Lot. To date there have been a series of meetings with legal teams to work thru an understanding about what is the City's liability and what is Columbia Gas's responsibility pertaining DEP concerns. Councilor LaBarge moved to recognize Robert Cleary from Columbia Gas; Councilor Adams seconded the motion. The motion passed on a voice vote of 9 Yes, 0 No. Mr. Cleary defined AUL as Activity and Use Limitations which is a tool provided by Massachusetts Regulations. Land that has been previously contaminated may be subject to certain AULs, which will limit future development opportunities. Current and future owners will need to be knowledgeable about what the limitations are. For example, building on the Roundhouse site for human occupancy in single family homes is not allowed. (The City's Municipal Building is not included in the footprint where restricted use is established.) Columbia Gas has already done certain clean up and protection activities. Partial removal of contaminated soil has already been done, followed by backfilling with clean fill. An orange film is used as a marker layer to show where clean-up of the soil has ended. Soil on top of the marker materials prevents odors.

The order presented to Council authorizes the Mayor to record 7 notices of Activity and Use Limitations with regard to 7 city properties and includes the Settlement Agreement with Columbia Gas of Massachusetts.

An Ordinance of the City of Northampton, Massachusetts, providing that the Code of Ordinances, City of Northampton, Massachusetts, be amended by revising section § 312-75 of said code; providing that Compression release engine brake use; operation of heavy commercial vehicles.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Northampton, in City Council assembled, as follows: that section § 312-75 of the Code of ordinances of the City of Northampton, Massachusetts, be amended so that such section shall read as follows:

§ 312-75 Compression release engine brake use; operation of heavy commercial vehicles.

B. The use and operation of heavy commercial vehicles as defined in § 312-1 are hereby restricted on the following named streets or parts thereof, and in the manner outlined and during the period of time set forth. Violators shall be subject to a fine of \$300.

C. Warnings and penalties for repeated use of truck detours. Operators of heavy commercial vehicles as defined in § 312-1 shall may first be issued an informational warning for using established truck detours on Lincoln Avenue and Phillips Place for the purpose of correcting a navigation error that would otherwise have led the vehicle to a prohibited route. However, operators who have previously received such a warning within the last two years shall be subject to a fine of \$300.

D. Exemptions. Subsection A of this section shall not apply to heavy commercial vehicles going to or coming from places upon such streets for the purpose of making deliveries of goods, materials, or merchandise to or similar collections from abutting land or buildings or adjoining streets or ways to which access cannot otherwise be gained; or to vehicles used in connection with the construction, maintenance and repair of such streets or public utilities therein; or to federal, state, municipal or public service corporation owned vehicles.

E. Signage. The Department of Public Works shall establish clear and conspicuous signage on prohibited streets and official detour routes indicating the nature of the commercial vehicle prohibition and dollar amount of the accompanying fine. Where the state may have jurisdiction, the Department of Public Works shall inform the Massachusetts Department of Transportation of signage needs.


