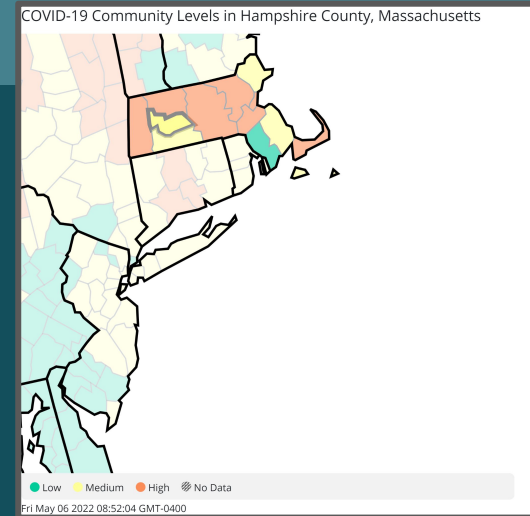
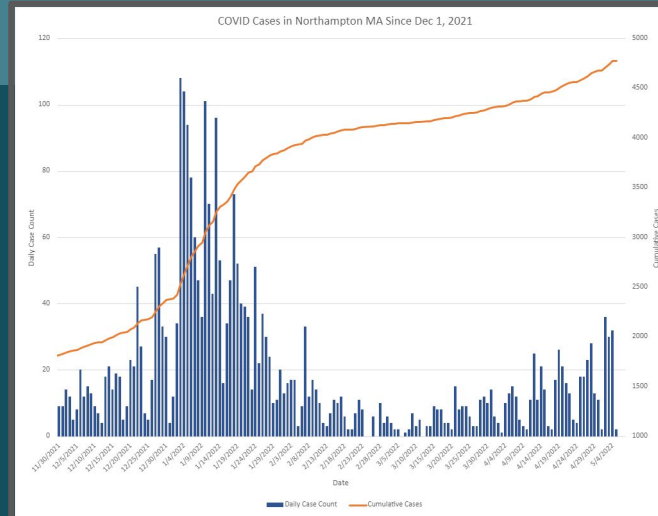

All data are extracted from MAVEN, MDPH, and vitals statistics reporting. Presented data assumes that data sources are current and accurate as of the date they are reported.

* Confirmed cases are those with reported molecular test (ie. PCR) results. Confirmed cases do not include reported rapid antigen test results.

**Home tests are reported in addition to provider-reported cases. Reported cases do not include self-tests performed at home or in other settings that are not required by law to report infectious diseases.

***Active cases are cases with reported positive molecular and antigen results, who are currently within their 10-day infectious period.

****Hospitalization and mortality data is calculated based on clinical data for confirmed, laboratory molecular tested cases of COVID-19 only. It does not include data extracted from cases with antigen tests, or otherwise probable or suspect cases of COVID-19. Clinical data is drawn from MAVEN surveillance reporting, individual patient report, and vitals statistics. Data may therefore be incomplete. Mortality and hospitalization data includes residents of congregate living facilities who may have had previous or permanent residence in another town/city.
